There's a place for you at UNE

Fewer than 55% of school students are offered a place at uni based on their ATAR. There are many pathways to university education, and the requirements differ across subjects.

We offer preparation courses like our Pathway Programs or admission via any VET studies you have undertaken during high school (Certificate III and up). You can even start uni early with our HSC University Pathways course. Your ATAR isn't all that counts. Your passion will lead to your success.

Intending to start work when you finish school? You can complete your studies online at UNE while you work.

Foundation Program

UNE's Foundation Program is designed to equip you with the knowledge, skills and self-confidence to excel in tertiary study. Our Foundation Program gives you up to two units of credit towards up to 25 different bachelor's degrees, reducing both the time and cost of your undergraduate degree. No matter what your educational background is or what area you are interested in studying, the flexibility of the UNE's Foundation Program will help you reach your goals in as little as eight months.

TRACKS Indigenous Foundation Program*

The TRACKS Indigenous Foundation Program is a university preparation program run by the Oorala Aboriginal Centre at UNE. It's designed to provide pathways for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students leaving school to become scientists, nurses, archaeologists, teachers, psychologists, and more by preparing you to take on a degree at UNE. This free program will make you eligible to apply for a range of UNE undergraduate courses, and you can take up to two undergraduate units (subjects) that may count towards your chosen course. Through the TRACKS program, you'll gain an understanding of university life and develop the skills needed to transition to university studies. You'll connect with a strong community that recognises and values your unique strengths, with all the support you need provided throughout your studies.

HSC University Pathways

This is a unique opportunity specifically for high school students. The course allows you to supplement your HSC by studying up to 2 first-year university units, alongside working on your ATAR. Develop knowledge in subject areas you're interested in with one of the wide range of units offered. You may also get advanced standing for the unit when you're ready to start your UNE degree. Real-world university study skills are embedded in each unit, with flexible learning and expert support throughout. This course is offered with a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP), giving you access to reduced fees and the ability to defer your fees to a HECS-HELP loan (eligibility criteria apply). Talk to your School Principal about recommending you for the course.

VET Studies: from Certificate III to UNE course

If you're in the process of, or planning to complete a Certificate III through Vocational Education and Training (VET), it could get you into uni. At UNE we offer a wide variety of diplomas and bachelor degrees with VET studies as an entry qualification, not just ATAR.

Diploma or bachelor?

If the job you want requires a diploma, you can start there. After completing the diploma, the option to apply for a bachelor degree is always open to you. If you are looking for a deeper, more comprehensive qualification with even broader career opportunities, applying for direct entry into a bachelor degree is a great option.
